Solemnization of Marriage

Only marriages between Filipinos are solemnized at the Philippine Embassy. The Philippine Embassy has jurisdiction over the Emirate of Abu Dhabi, including Al Ain while the Philippine Consulate General in Dubai has jurisdiction over Dubai and all the northern Emirates.

Requirements:

- 1. Personal appearance of both contracting parties
- 2. Original and two (2) copies of the contracting parties' birth certificate, duly certified by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) and authenticated by the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) in Manila
- 3. Original and two (2) photocopies of PSA Certificate of No Marriage (CENOMAR) for each contracting party, duly authenticated by the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) in Manila
- 4. Three (3) copies of the passports of the contracting parties
- 5. Three (3) copies of the passports of the witnesses
- 6. Two (2) recent passport-size pictures of the contracting parties
- 7. Affidavit of Parental Consent of the parents of party/ies aged 18- 21, duly authenticated by the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) in Manila
- 8. Affidavit of Parental Advice of the parents of party/ies aged 22-25, duly authenticated by the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) in Manila
- 9. Processing Fee of 240 AED

STEPS AFTER SUBMISSION OF REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. There will be a marriage bann or announcement of the marriage to be posted at the premises of the Philippine Embassy for fifteen (15) consecutive working days, after which, the parties may get their Marriage License.
- 2. Schedule the date of marriage and visit the Embassy on the scheduled date of marriage.
- 3. Come back after 1 working day of the wedding to get your Marriage Contract.
- The Embassy sends the documents to the Department of Foreign Affairs in Manila every 2nd week of each month. You may call or email the Embassy to get the Despatch Number.
